Grand Theater of Geneva Opera House



The International Monument to the Reformation built in 1909 honors the Protestant Reformation. The Wall is on the grounds of the University of Geneva, which was founded by John Calvin. The major figures of the Reformation are depicted as giant statues and bas-reliefs.



Geneva Flower Clock is an outdoor flower clock dedicated to Geneva's watchmakers. It's second hand is the longest in the world at 8.2 feet. There are around 6,500 flowering plants and shrubs used for the clock face and they change as the seasons change.




Geneva, Switzerland is home to many International Organizations Headquarters.

The hotel we stayed in Montreux was the Eden Palace.




Day #5: Our view of the sunrise on the snow capped mountains on our hotel room balcony.



We took the Golden Pass Train through the Alps to Gstaad with breathtaking scenery, mountain passes and unforgettable views.






Gstaad is known as a popular ski resort among the international jet set.

In America, we have soft drinks in our vending machines. In Gstaad, Switzerland, they have cheese-to-go!








Queen - The Studio Experience was in the Montreux Casino. Queen recorded a total of seven albums at Mountain Studios in the Montreux Casino. Queen owned the building from 1979 to 1996. The band quickly discovered that Montreux offered a respite from the glare of media attention, allowing them to write and record in relative peace. The exhibition includes photos and memorabilia from Queen's personal archives.





The control room and many of the fixtures and sound equipment has not been changed since Queen worked there.


ORIGINAL STRUDER A80 ANALOGUE 24 TRACK

The bronze statue of Freddie Mercury which stands on the edge of the lake by the market square in Montreux was donated to the town by Queen and the Freddie Mercury Estate.

The Czechoslovakian sculptor and Fellow of the Royal British Society of Sculptors, Irena Sedlecká, was commissioned to sculpt the statue and it was unveiled on 25th November 1996 by Freddie's parents Boni and Jer Bulsara, Freddie's opera singing partner Montserrat Caballé, and Queen's Brian May and Roger Taylor.


